FROM THE DIRECTOR

As I completed my first year as director of the Oxford Community Choice Pantry in 2014 I was able to realize the range of responsibilities for the job and become more comfortable with them, but also to begin to compare operation with the prior year. When 2014 turned into 2015 I was able to compare some numbers and what I found was interesting.

We had exactly the same number of clients registered for service in 2014 as we had in 2013—a total of 578 unduplicated households. That is the number of households which came to the pantry for help at least once during the year.

In 2013, we had 184 NEW households register for service including double-digit new households in 10 of the 12 months. With exactly the same number of registered households eligible to come to the pantry every two weeks in 2014, we still added 176 NEW household registrations last year. That means that an equal number dropped off or our rolls. We have no way of knowing if those households moved out of the school district or got into a better income situation, but we hope it's the latter and that they are now able to better sustain themselves financially.

That must be a success story for the pantry and we are happy for those former clients.

The other side of that coin, however, is that 176 households decided in 2014 that they needed help to get through the month and came to us for help in feeding their families.

Most pantries provide service once a month but the Oxford Community Choice Pantry allows clients to come for food every two weeks. Many come just in the second half of the month because their money runs out before the month runs out and make only one visit a month.

While it is good news that we took in 176 new households as clients in 2014 with the number of households served at least once staying the same, there is another number that is telling for the people we serve. Those 578 households recorded in 2013 used the pantry an average of SIX times that year. That same number of 578 households came an average of SEVEN times in 2014, so their need rose from one year to the next.

Actual household visits—some once a month and some twice—rose from 4,033 in 2013 to 4,391 last year.

There is still tremendous need out there and we could not help these friends and neighbors without the help of a very generous community. Monetary donations are certainly always needed as we make regular purchases of perishable items as well as bulk monthly purchases through our regional food bank, Shared Harvest, and need to pay electric, heating and other monthly bills.

We also have very generous donations of food, both through major food drives and through donations by student and community groups and individuals. In 2014, we received a total of 70,528 pounds of food through the course of the year.

We also could not survive without generous donations of time. Permanent residents and Miami students combined to work a total of 3,558 hours in 2014. Their help was invaluable as receptionists, shopping assistants and food stockers and sorters as well as drivers to pick up donations and deliver to shut-ins, and even clean floors and shelves and refrigerators.

I like to tell people that all four words in our name are important but if we had to rank them, "Community" would probably top the list.

From the President of the Board...



Although all food pantries are challenged by national and local changes, we live in a community that offers tremendous support to our neighbors who need help now. The Oxford Community Choice Pantry is here to help alleviate hunger and food insecurity in our community now.

To this end, we're very fortunate to have the leadership of Bob Ratterman, second director of the OCCP, who continues to bring community involvement to our mission. Operating with three loyal part-time staff members--Bob Ratterman, Candace Roseman, and Jeremy Long--and many dedicated volunteers and board members, the OCCP has a great team that works together to achieve our common goals.

Volunteers at the Pantry come from all segments of our town. I am pleased to see these individual and group efforts strengthened by the synergy happening in our town now. Support comes from the Oxford and Miami University community, volunteers and students, parents and children, many food drives run by social and religious groups, fraternities and sororities, and community organizations. We receive support from the City of Oxford, the Oxford Community Foundation, United Way, the Community Garden, and the Oxford Farmers' Market whose apt motto is "cultivating community," and many commercial establishments. Empty Bowls is the largest annual fundraiser involving hundreds of dedicated volunteers. Last year, Empty Bowls had become so large under Connie Malone's leadership that it was held at the Oxford Community Art Center which coincidentally also has community as the second word in its name.

This past year we benefitted from more Miami University student involvement: Our first student intern, Sherry Wong, graduated, but we continue to have volunteers studying in the nutrition and dietetics and social work programs, and we added a new board member position specifically for a Miami student, now held by Hannah Surwillo.

Our board members are a tremendously innovative and creative group. Right now we are working together on our Strategic Planning for the next five years. One of the issues facing us is the location of the Pantry because the generous gift of the loan of the white house at St. Mary's Cemetery is one that we cannot count on forever. Although a move is not imminent, we need to prepare in the long term either to make necessary improvements to the old building or to move to a different location. Such preparation involves calculating costs and benefits. Among our needs, for example, is improved food storage capacity. This year we received a generous offer of a future donation of land, so we are beginning a systematic study, spearheaded by two board members, Jon Scaffidi and Lara Osborne, to determine what impact moving to another location would have on the people we serve. We want to be sure that our services are as accessible as possible for all our customers.

With this annual report we review our accomplishments and celebrate the generosity of many donors, some of whom wish to remain anonymous. Oxford is a generous community, where people care about each other and help one another through hard times. We all know that it really is a question of paying it forward. Being involved as a volunteer shopping assistant or a board member are experiences that are rewarding beyond measure. Donations of time, food, and money are all deeply appreciated.

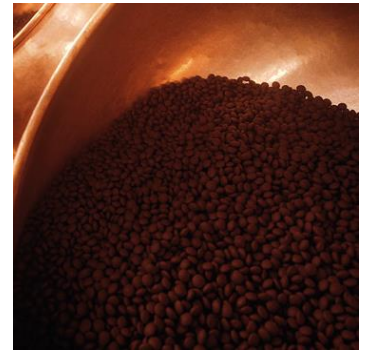

OCCP FACTS



- The Oxford Community Choice Pantry opened in July 2007 as a nonprofit community organization serving the Talawanda School District. The new food pantry for the area combined the resources and expertise of prior existing food pantries of The Family Resource Center and St. Mary Church's St. Vincent de Paul Society. Both organizations used their staff and volunteers to shift food access to the new pantry that adopted the choice food pantry model.
- The philosophy of the OCCP is to empower its customers by honoring their dignity and giving them responsibility for their food choices. The pantry emphasizes the selection of healthy food options while providing nutritional information.
- The OCCP serves nearly 600 households in the Talawanda School District, representing almost 2000 individuals. It also provides home delivery of food for homebound adults and seniors.
- Eligibility for food assistance at the pantry is determined by poverty income levels established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). Customers must provide a photo ID and proof of residency in the Talawanda School District. Only one member of a household may register for service at the pantry. A customer's food allotment is determined by their household size which they can access every 14 days.
- Pantry volunteers include community residents and Miami University students. They serve as shopping assistants, receptionists, food stockers and sorters.
